He then moved to Iowa but returned later and served again as Government observer from 1911 until his death. He was 84 years of age, the oldest observer in the State. He prepared the meteorological reports for the Monmouth dailr papers and in this work he was unusually interested and attentive. Prof. Hutchison was much loved and respected in his community and the Weather Bureau has lost an efficient and conscientious worker. The departures from normal temperature and precipitation are computed only for such stations...
